The University of Arkansas Libraries hold more than 1.7 million volumes of books and bound periodicals, and over 5.5 million microforms and government documents. Additionally, the University Libraries subscribe to over 18,100 print and electronic journals. Other resources within the library include thousands of maps, manuscripts, and audio and video recordings.

Circulation staff provide many services, such as check-out and return of materials (including laptops), holds, recalls, assignment of graduate carrels and group study rooms, retrieval of items in storage, management of print and electronic reserves, pick up for ILL items, and lost & found. A current U of A ID card is required to check out materials and rooms. The check-out period is generally 16 weeks for books and 1 week for bound journals. Self check-out is available. Individuals not currently enrolled in or employed by the University may apply for privileges for a fee.

Patrons can use the Libraries' interlibrary loan service to obtain materials that the Libraries do not own. Patrons can request items and receive full-text articles electronically through the Web-based ILLiad service. Many databases offer a convenient direct link to ILLiad.

Reference staff assist researchers in locating and using library materials at the Reference Desk, by telephone, e-mail, and chat. Subject librarians teach users how to find, evaluate, and use information, either individually or in the classroom. The Libraries are a depository for official US and Arkansas publications, which cover legislation, regulations, social issues, education, and statistics. Reference staff assist patrons in the use of government documents, GIS services, and maps. Students and faculty are encouraged to make appointments for in-depth reference consultations.

### **General Access Computing Lab**

Mullins Library in partnership with Computing Services provides 96 workstations with the full suite of software available at other GACLs. Lab assistants and reference librarians are available.

### **Study Areas—Quiet and Group**

Most areas of Mullins Library—including the Helen Robson Walton Reading Room and the Hodges Reading Room—are for quiet study. Group study rooms accommodating 2 to 6 students are available for 3 hour check-out at the West Entrance Service Desk. Each room includes a large LCD screen to which a laptop can be connected; cables are available for check-out. Tables in the Reference area on the Lobby Level also may be used for group projects.
